



Head to the river. The northern reach, that is. Leisurely strell down the River Walk's Museum Reach and pit stop at Pearl for local food, entertainment and fun. Explore the San Antonio Botanical Garden and parks along South Broadway, or catch a concern of the banks of the river. The experience is yours for the tabling. Come see what's new.

# HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE

In 1881, the City Brewery was founded on Pearl grounds. And, by 1916, it was the largest brewery in Texas. What's more is, under the direction of Chief Executive Officer Emma Koehler, it was the only brewery in San Antonio to survive prohibition.

# Neighborhood Favorites

Walk, hike or bike the 1.3 mile Museum Reach for views of unique public art including an exhibit called "FLS.M." that includes 22 sunfish swimming in the sky under the I-35 overpass near Camden Street. Visit the San Antonio Museum of Art known for its collection of ancient Mediterranean. Asian, and Latin American art: Grab a light bite at Ocho in Hotel Havana for pan-Latin influences, dine al fresco at The Laxury, a walk-up restaurant inside a cargo container that serves sandwiches and craft beers, visit the VFW Post on the river front, or wander through the Japanese Tea Garden and eat at the Jingu House Cafe. Make time for a visit to the city's lodging-gem. Hotel Emma, while visiting the eateries, bars and shops at Pearl. Fin family fun, consider a morning at San Antonio Zoo, visit the dinosaur exhibits at The Witte Museum, feed the ducks at Brackenridge Park, explore the grounds at the San Antonio Botanical Garden, or stop by to learn something new at The DoSeum. Come explore what's new.



# Stay

Emma. Or, kick back at Hotel Havana for a boutique experience just north of downtown. Check out bed & breakfasts along Broadway for an intimate, local lodging experience.

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### Dine

For casual fare and plenty of options, check out the city's only food half. The Bottling Department, or wist the inviting patio at nearth Down on Grayson. For upscale and familyfriendly eats, consider Cured at Pearl or Tra Trattoria at San Antonio Museum of Art. And don't leave the area without a little something sweet – macarons, anyone? – from Bakery Lorraine.


