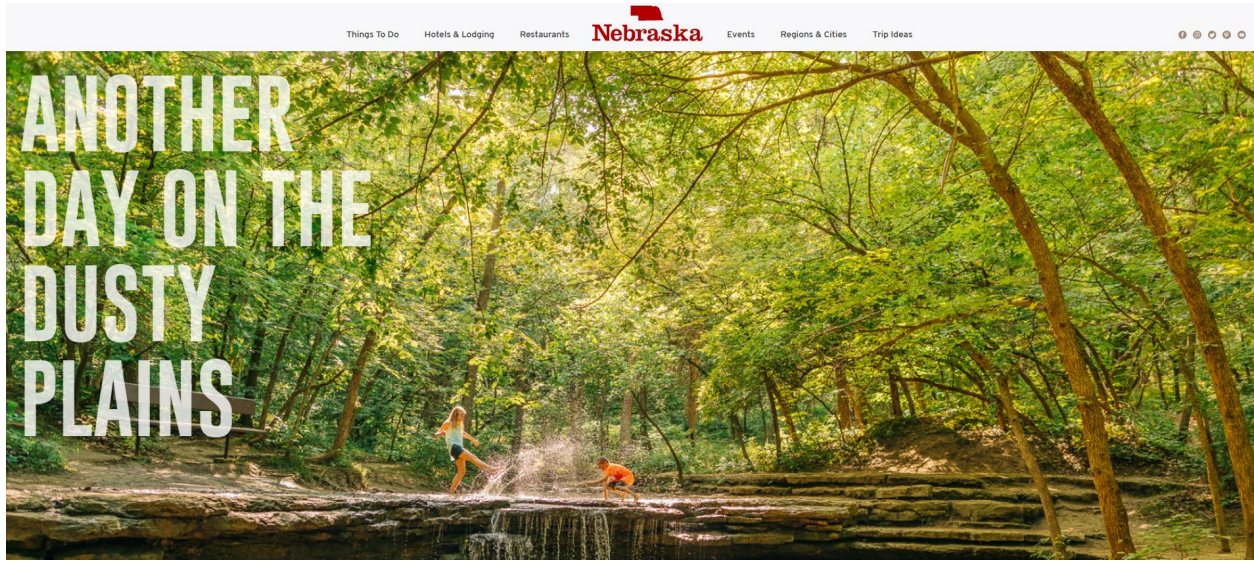

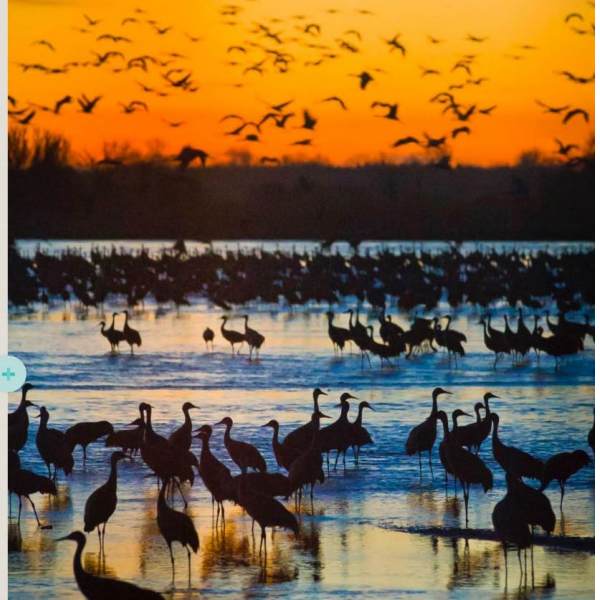

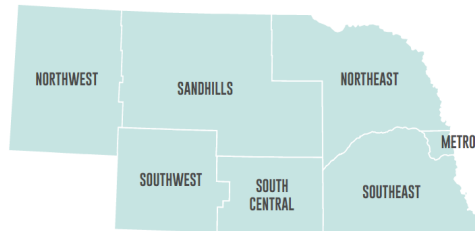
STRICTLY FOR THE BIRDS
