
TREASURES FOUND HERE


Spanish Market



For an unforgettable winter vacation, bring your family to ski in New Mexico, where après is just the beginning. The state's eight alpine ski areas all offer stunning scenery, mouthwatering cuisine, and unique culture that's generations in the making.

Take the gondola to the top of Ski Apache, the country's southernmost ski resort, to access 55 runs for all skill levels. Affordable prices and a friendly ski school take the stress out of group travel—and the bluebird days don't hurt either.

In the Enchanted Circle, head to Red River for small-town flavor and holiday festivals like the Christmas Eve torchlight parade. Grab a hearty meal at Shotgun Willie's, then stay at the Copper King Lodge for exceptional views and ski-in ski-out convenience. Or make your way to Taos, where world-class terrain meets family-friendly features like daycare, tubing for kids, and one of the country's top-rated ski shops.

Sunny days meet chile nights in Santa Fe. End a day of fresh powder with chile rellenos at Joseph's, followed by a local brew at Draft Station on the plaza downtown. On your day off, venture over to Meow Wolf, a funky, interactive art experience that wows all ages.

Artesia

Take a stroll through the past in downtown Artesia, where a historic walking tour features bronze sculptures of cowboys, cattle, and pioneers. Discover a western town's transition from ranching hub to bustling oil town with larger-than-life sculptures that bring history alive.

Along the way, you'll find the Ocotillo Performing Arts Center, a lively venue that's home to classical and world music, dance, theater, and comedy. Or stop in at the Artesia Historical Museum and Art Center, which features photographs, artifacts, and exhibits that tell the story of this Pecos Valley community. A meal at Henry's Barbeque is a guaranteed treat (especially if you get the green chile brisket).
